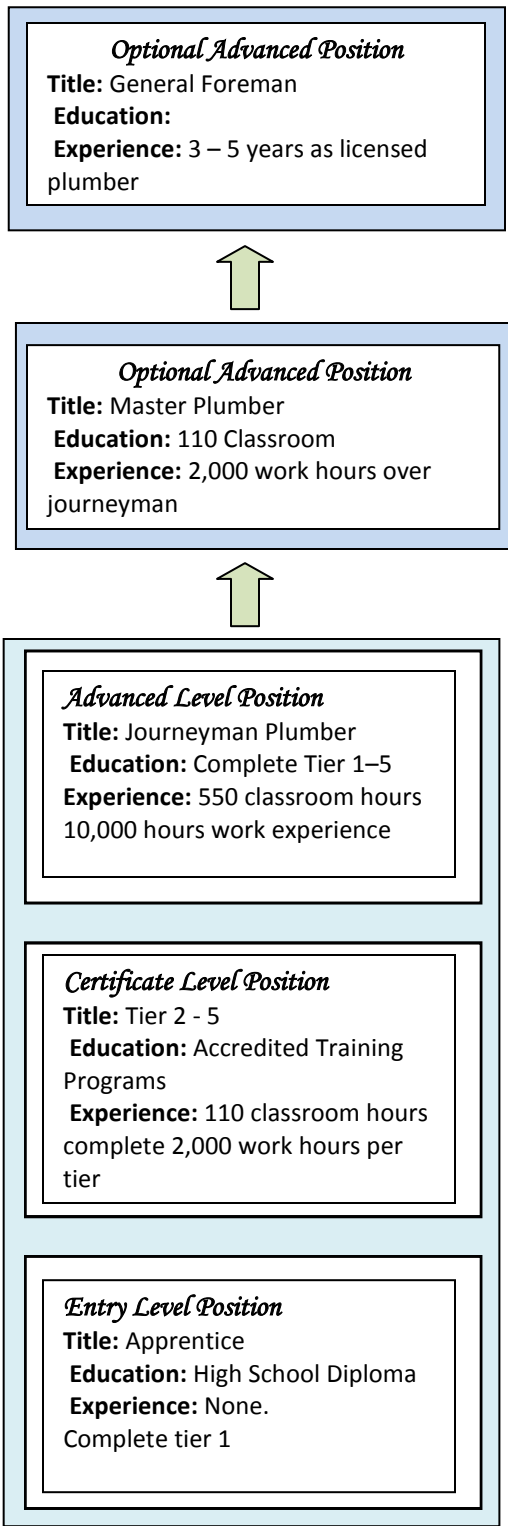

Career at a Glance

Plumbers are needed wherever fresh water must be supplied and wastewater removed. They are responsible for fitting pipes and fixtures, installing water supplies, drainage & sewage systems, and making repairs to existing systems. Many plumbers often specialize in one area such as residential, commercial, or industrial plumbing; while others concentrate on new construction.

What to expect while in this program at Assabet Valley

While in this program students will utilize planned theory and live work situations to gain skill in all aspects of the residential and commercial plumbing trades. Focused learning areas include DWV installation, water & gas piping, sprinkler fitting, various heating systems and service and repair of such. Related theory includes applied mathematics and practical science of plumbing, national & state plumbing codes.

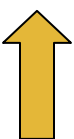
